# REFERENCE CARD

## System Requirements

- IBM PC or 100% PC compatible, 386 or 486 processor
- DOS 5.0 or higher
- Minimum of 2 megabytes of RAM
- 3 Megabytes of free Hard Disk Space
- VGA graphics

**NOTE:** Operation Europe is not MS Windows compatible. EMS memory is required. Please read the ***Problem Solving*** section at the end of this card if you experience problems starting the game after installation.

## Installing to Hard Disk

This game must be installed to a hard disk. You need at least 3 megabytes of free space on your hard drive to install the game.

Your game package should contain 2 floppy disks (Disk 1 and Disk 2) or 1 CD-ROM.

1. Insert Disk 1 into your floppy disk drive (or place the CD-ROM in your CD-ROM drive) and move to the drive. To move to Drive A, for example, type **A:** at the DOS prompt and press Enter.
2. Type **INSTALL** and press ENTER. The installation program will begin.
3. Follow the on-screen instructions.
4. When installation is complete, exit from the installation program by pressing Enter. Move to the sub-directory where you installed Operation Europe.
5. Type **KOEI**, ENTER to start the game.

**Note:** If installation fails, read the ***Problem Solving*** section of this card.

# Mouse and Keyboard Operation

Operation Europe supports both mouse and keyboard play. A mouse is recommended for easier command input.

MOUSE	KEYBOARD	FUNCTION
Left Button	Enter Key	Answer YES.  Enter commands and numerical values.
Right Button	ESC Key and 0 Key	Answer NO.  Cancel commands and numerical values.  Execute multiple input operations.
	Numerical Key Pad	Move cursor through menus and commands.
	Y and N Keys	Select YES/NO answers.

## Selecting Subcommands

### MOUSE

Left-click on a main command to bring up its subcommands, then left-click on a highlighted subcommand to select it. Clicking right will return you one step back.

### KEYBOARD

Using the numerical key pad, move the cursor to a main command and press **Enter** to display subcommands. Then highlight the subcommand you wish to execute, and press **Enter**. The 0 key or ESC will return you one step back.

## Entering Numerical Values

### MOUSE

To input a value, slide the mouse cursor across the red Input Bar at the top of the Number Input Window. Or, left-click on the five digits to increase and right-click to decrease values one by one. Click the left mouse button, or YES, to enter the value. Click the right mouse button, or NO, to cancel out of the input window.

Use the Move Pad to move the Number Input Window to a desired place on the screen.

## KEYBOARD

Use numerical keys to input a value. Press **Enter** to enter the value. Press **Backspace** to delete the input value.

## Selecting a Destination or Target On the Map

### MOUSE

Left-click on a destination or target.

### KEYBOARD

Use the numerical pad to move the cursor to a destination or target, and press **Enter**. The chart to the right illustrates use of the key pad to direct the cursor.

# Problem Solving

## Installation Problem

If installation fails when you attempt to run the installation program, you need to reboot your computer with the Operation Europe Boot Disk. Follow Steps 1 to 5 in ***Creating a Boot Disk***, then retry the installation procedures in ***Installing to Hard Disk***.

## System Memory

If you are having problems starting Operation Europe, you may not have enough conventional memory and EMS memory free to play the game.

Operation Europe is a complex simulation and requires at least 540K bytes of free conventional memory as well as 100k bytes of EMS memory.

Check your "Largest executable program size" and free EMS memory by typing **MEM** at the DOS command prompt. If you do not have enough conventional memory available to play Operation Europe, read ***Finding Free Memory*** below.

## EMS Memory

EMS (Expanded) memory is required to play Operation Europe. Your system configuration file, CONFIG.SYS, must contain a statement that activates a memory manager that will give you EMS memory. Please check your DOS reference manual for additional information on EMS memory.

## System File Handles

Your system configuration file, CONFIG.SYS, must have a minimum of 40 system file handles. Edit CONFIG.SYS and make sure you have the line "FILES=40", or above.

Please refer to your DOS reference manual for information on checking and editing CONFIG.SYS.

## Finding Free Memory

Here are three methods you can follow to free conventional memory:

- Check that your CONFIG.SYS file contains the line: DOS=HIGH.
- Load your TSR programs into high memory instead of conventional memory (Check your DOS manual or Memory Manager manual for more details).
- Or, create a Boot Disk to bypass loading any TSR programs. See details below.

## Creating a Boot Disk

If you are having problems installing or starting the game, you may want to create a bootable floppy (Boot Disk) that you will use to start your computer. The Boot Disk will create an environment which will allow you to install or start the game.

1. You will need a blank disk.
2. Insert the game disk Disk 1 into a floppy disk drive (or place the game CD-ROM in your CD-ROM drive) and move to the drive.
3. At the DOS prompt, type **BOOTDISK A**.
4. Follow the on-screen instructions.
5. When your new Boot Disk is successfully created, reset your computer with the Boot Disk in the floppy drive.

## Playing from Boot Disk

If you are having difficulty starting the game, you should use your Boot Disk to reboot your computer every time you start the game.

To play Operation Europe from the Boot Disk, follow these directions:

1. Insert the Operation Europe Boot Disk in your floppy drive and restart your computer.
2. If you would like to use your mouse to play Operation Europe, install your mouse driver at this point. To install your mouse driver, go to the sub-directory where the driver is located, and type the installation command. For example, if you have Microsoft® Mouse, change to the sub-directory MSMOUSE and type **MOUSE**. Please refer to your mouse documentation for more details.

3. Switch to the drive where you have installed Operation Europe. For example: Type **C:**, ENTER. Then type **CD OPEU** (or the name of the sub-directory you created for Operation Europe), ENTER.

4. Type **KOEI**, ENTER to start the game.
