

EUROPEAN CHALLENGE™ TEST DRIVE II™ SCENERY DISK

Instruction Card

The only instruction: See your Test Drive II manual to find out how to use **EUROPEAN CHALLENGE** with **THE DUEL: TEST DRIVE II**. Pay most attention to the section called *HOW TO USE THE INSTALL OPTION*.

Important Notes

1 After you boot up the Master Disk for The Duel: Test Drive II, and you want to use the Scenery Disk, you must assign the Scenery Disk to a drive. You will then be instructed to insert your Scenery Disk into the assigned drive. At that time a serial number is assigned to that disk. Play Disks can then be created with that Scenery Disk only with the Master Disk that was in use when the serial number was assigned.

MAC users: You are the exception to the above. After you boot up the Master Disk for The Duel: Test Drive II, and you want to use the Scenery Disk, you must install the Scenery Disk. After installation, a serial number is assigned that disk. Playsets can then be created with that Scenery Disk only with the Master Disk that was in use when the serial number was assigned.

2 IBM, Tandy users: Because so many graphics have been packed into European Challenge, there are space limitations on the disk. Therefore, you can only make a Play Disk with European Challenge using a 3.5" disk drive, a high-density disk drive, or a hard drive.

3 APPLE IIGS users: in Step 3 of *HOW TO USE THE INSTALL OPTION* you must type **/Eurochal** instead of **/Califchal**. Then press **return**.

That's it. That's all. The other side of this card provides a description of each roadscape along the six legs of the European Challenge.
