## DEMONSTRATING

## THE MODEL 2000

To start the demo, boot up and put the diskette in drive A. At the prompt "Strike a key when ready", press any key to begin the demo. If you would like to read the instructions before the demo starts, press CONTROL-C at the prompt "Strike a key when ready". Then enter "TYPE README.TXT" for the instructions. To start the demo, enter "RUNDEMO".

The demo can run by itself. It will cycle through selected screens until someone presses a key.

Anytime the ESC key is pressed, the demo will restart.

There are two menus - the MAIN MENU (which draws the Model 2000) and the SOFTWARE MENU (which draws the Software Wheels). The MAIN MENU comes after an introduction to the Model 2000. The SOFTWARE MENU is reached by selecting option 7 at the MAIN MENU. From these two menus you can get to any part of the demo by pressing the appropriate key. In order to use the Numeric Keypad to select options, you must have the NUM LOCK key on.

After you have selected an option, the demo will show you information on that topic. The demo then will give you a choice to see additional information on this topic (reached by pressing ENTER) or to return to the previous menu (reached by pressing any key). If you choose additional information, you can return to the previous menu by pressing any key.

At any time you can press the HOLD key to pause the demo. When you are ready to continue, press the HOLD key again.

After each screen the demo pauses before it draws the next screen. If the pause is to long and you are ready to go on, press the SPACE BAR to move to the next screen.

If someone is at the demo selecting options and they leave, the demo will continue on by itself and go into the self-running cycle.

While the demo is in the self-running cycle, you can return to the previous menu by pressing any key at the end of a section. (There is not a prompt for this).

The BREAK key has been disabled, so the demo will continue to run even after the BREAK key has been pressed.

To end the demo, press CONTROL-C then type "SYSTEM".

During the Word Processing demo, the viewer may get a printout, describing the products features. In order to get a printout, you need a DMP printer connected to the Model 2000. If you do not have a printer connected, the program will pause and continue to the next screen.

The demo also gives you a chance to get a screen copy of the bar chart and the stacked line chart. This requires a CGP-220 to be connected to the Model 2000. The demo will hang if you request a print and a CGP-220 is not connected.
