QUICK REFERENCE GUIDE



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The command sequences shown in the Lyrix Quick Reference Guide represent the standard version of Lyrix. These keystrokes have been selected because they can be used with many different kinds of terminals.

Because Lyrix command sequences can easily be changed, either by the user or the system administrator, you can after your version of Lyrix to contain different command keystrokes.

It is possible that your Lyrix command keystrokes may already have been altered to take advantage of the convenient function keys available on some terminals.

To locate a command in this guide, find the name of the command group on one of the tabs. For example, to exit a document, turn to the tab that says "Exit".

All Lyrix command keystrokes are represented in boxes. Each box contains a single keystroke.

The letter n indicates that you will need to specify a number to execute a print command.

The Escape and Control keys on your terminal are represented by \square and \square boxes.

When using the Escape key to type a command, press ESC and release; press key or key sequence, and release.

When using the Control key, press CTL and hold; press key; release CTL and key together.

Cut and Paste Diagram

You can use Cut and Paste commands to delete, move, copy, and insert marked pieces of text. In this example, the first sentence is marked with Serial Cut and Paste:

MARK TOP LEFT SERIAL

This diagram shows how to perform a Serial Cut and Paste operation. First, mark the top left corner of text, then the bottom and select what type of cut you want to make. In this example, the marked text is being removed.

Status Line

Whenever you enter a file, Lyrix displays a status line across the top of the screen. Here is an example of a Lyrix status line:

The current ruler is always displayed beneath the status line.



All Lyrix print commands are typed and displayed as part of your text when you create or edit a file. The commands are processed when you print the file and do not appear on the printed page.
