#### MODEL 4/111 ACCOUNTS PAYABLE (26-1542) - STARTING THE SYSTEMS

The manual states that Accounts Payable can run as a stand alone program or interfaced with General Ledger. Keep in mind that if you start your Accounts Payable system as stand-alone and then decide to interface, you will have to clear all invoices from the Accounts Payable system. This is not very practical, so advise potential Accounts Payable/General Ledger customers of the work involved if they don't start the systems simultaneously!

When using Scripsit 2.1 with the DWP-510 and Sheet Feeder (26-1477), use PRTPCH to specify DWP410 as the driver. Then, at the Scripsit print menu, specify "F" for Daisy Wheel II Sheet Feeder. This will prevent the "PRINTER NOT READY" problem.

### MODEL 12 & 16 PAYROLL (26-4603 & 26-6203) - MISSISSIPPI STATE INCOME TAX

The new Mississippi State Tax Code allows personal exemptions from State Withholding in excess of the 4 digit field (field number 24) in the Employee File. If the customer encounters this problem because an employee is entitled to an exemption of \$10,000 or more, the following should be used to work around the problem. If you use this for one employee, you must use it for all employees in the system.

- Enter \$500 in field 23, State W/H Exemption Amount, in the Mississippi State Tax Table.
- For each employee, figure the total dollar exemption amount. Divide this
  amount by \$500 to arrive at the total number of Exemptions from State
  Withholding. Enter this amount in the Employee File, Field 24.

Number Exemptions = Total \$ Exemption Amount / 500

Example: Married Employee with 2 Dependents

Number of Exemptions = (9500 + 1500 + 1500) / 500

The result of 25 would be entered in Field 24 in the employee file.

Customer Service has tested local printing form a DT-100 using the DW II (26-1158) and Sheet Feeder (26-1448). Set the switch on the Sheet Feeder to 13 and specify 78 for the page length (using 8 1/2 by 11 inch paper). Also, don't forget to specify a new "offset from left side of page" on your print screen.
